We will be forced to raise tuition costs as we expand to pay for these unnecessary projects. **Current projections show an additional \$667 in increased tuition on students to pay for these unwanted city mandates.**

The City Council election for the City of Lynchburg is Tuesday, May 4, 2010. The three open seats, on the seven member council, will determine policies that directly Liberty's future and the thriving community.
